

MANITOBA PRACTICE ASSESSMENT PROGRAM (MPAP)

Full registration in Manitoba is granted to physicians who hold either (a) the LMCC and certification by the College of Family Physicians of Canada or (b) certification by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. Physicians who do not meet the criteria for full registration may be granted provisional registration, family practice limited class or specialty practice limited class for a period of time in order to permit them to meet the requirements for full registration in Manitoba.

One of the routes to full registration is through successful completion of an approved summative assessment, the Manitoba Practice Assessment Program. [The summative assessment process](#) is conducted by the University of Manitoba, Rady Faculty of Health Sciences, Continuing Competency & Assessment.
